

## SCLA Youth Program Record Sheet - 2010



This sheet must be presented at the Championship Show in San Antonio, completed and signed, before contestant will be allowed to compete in the Championship Show. Please note the requirements, based on your experience, and choose the corresponding number of required activities. These activities are cumulative from year to year, as no one is expected to complete all activities in one year's time. These suggestions are intended to be used as goals over several years of participation in the SCLA Youth Program. Please refer to the rules sheet for further information.

ACCORDING TO YOUR YEARS WORKING WITH LLAMAS MARK YOUR CHOICES FOR THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF ACTIVITIES: Adult llama leader must date and initial to verify knowledge has been demonstrated.

One year or less: Items 1-5

Over one year: Add one item for each additional year you have worked with llamas

			1) Feeding / Care i.e.: What do llamas eat and drink?
			2) Grooming i.e.: How to groom a llama with assorted grooming tools.
			3) Obstacle Work i.e.: Practice with a llama over an obstacle course.
			4) Handling / Halter i.e.: How to catch a llama, put a halter on a llama & how to tie a quick release knot.
			5) Books / Videos / Articles i.e.: List what you have read / watched about llamas. (use back of this sheet)
			6) Share llama activity with family, friends, classmates & others as appropriate for age. i.e.: Mail a photograph of you and a llama to your grandmother.
			7) Showmanship attire. i.e.: What kind of clothing do you wear into the show ring from head to toe?
			8) Etiquette / Good Sportsmanship as each one of the contestants & their llamas are winners. i.e.: Good manners; congratulate other winners, praise your llama win or loose.
			9) Write a story using any of your llama experiences to complete a school assignment. i.e. Vocabulary, language, history, science
			10) Invite a friend to join you on a llama adventure. i.e.: Go on a llama trek - have a picnic with your llama.
			11) Be a llama mentor to a less-experienced llama handler. i.e.: Show them how to do things and share your knowledge.
			12) Prepare a presentation about your Llama Youth Project for delivery to an adult service club. i.e. Lions Club, Rotary Club, Chamber of Commerce, Church Groups
			13) Prepare presentation about your Llama Youth Project for delivery to youth groups. i.e.: Elementary schools, Jr. High, 4-H Club, FFA, Home-schoolers.
			14) Volunteer to help at SCLA functions.
			15) Take your llama to share with a nursing home, senior citizen's center, Ronald McDonald House, etc.
			16) Invent new obstacles & design a new obstacle course for your group.

			i.e.: Be creative; think up new things to dazzle your llama & llama friends.
			17) Submit a llama-related article for publication. i.e.: Write an article for your school newsletter, local newspaper or the Humming Herald.
			18) Design & conduct a practice show for your youth group. i.e. Choose a judge, select classes & make this a learning experience to get ready for the shows.
			19) Volunteer for story time at a day-care facility or library and read llama stories aloud. i.e.: "Is Your Mama a Llama?" would be great to share with small children.
			20) Any other age appropriate activity to enhance the goals of SCLA * and promote the enjoyment and love of llamas (attach another sheet to completely describe the activity).

## South Central Llama Association 2010 Youth Championship Show Rules



“The objective of the SCLA Youth Llama Program is to encourage youth development through involvement with the care and handling of llamas”.

- 1) Youth age groups: Kria Kids: 5-8 years old; Junior: 9-13 years old; Senior: 14-19 years old.
- 2) Pre-registration for the 2010 Championship show is not required. The deadline for entries without a show late fee of \$25.00 requires a postmark of no later than Jan. 9, 2010. Championship show entry forms shall be mailed to Christie Stewart, 110 Robins Lane, Combine, TX 75159. Parental signature is required on the insurance waiver; please request the waiver form in advance from your Regional Director or go to the SCLA web site and print off the form under “SCLA Youth” (<http://www.scla.us/youth.html>). Late entries may be accepted. There will be a \$25.00 late fee, this fee will allow the youth to enter in all classes (halter, showmanship, obstacle and judging).
- 3) Youth may show only one llama and a llama may only be shown by one person at the Championship show. They may be entered in the performance classes, halter, obstacle and judging.
- 4) If a youth pre-registers for the Championship show and the following occurs: death of, injury to, or sale of the llama, with proof of death or sale, or a veterinary statement of the extent of injury that requires the llama to withdraw, the Youth Committee must be contacted for approval of a substitute llama.
- 5) Bring your completed and signed SCLA YOUTH PROGRAM RECORD SHEET with you to the Championship show. Be sure to keep an identical copy for next year’s program.
- 6) Youth must be an associate member of the SCLA to participate in the SCLA Youth Program. Youth may not participate in the Championship Show without an active adult SCLA member sponsor. Adult sponsor must have current SCLA dues paid for 2010. If 2010 youth dues and/or adult dues are not paid by Feb. 8, 2010, please pay those dues to Christie Stewart at the start of the Championship show.
- 7) Youth do not have to own the llama they show. Please provide a Permission to Show form, available under “SCLA Youth” on the SCLA web site (<http://www.scla.us/youth.html>).
- 8) Anyone between the ages of 5 to 19 as of 1-1-2010 may show in the SCLA Youth Show. All ages are determined as of JANUARY 1, 2010. This is for both handler and llama.
- 9) No intact male llama over 24 months can be shown in the SCLA Youth Program. Age as of 1-1-2010. Senior youth, ages 14-19, may be allowed to show an intact male llama over 24 months of age, with the stipulation that if youth is unable to control the animal they will be excused from the ring.
- 10) Non-Breeding llamas must be verified to have been sterilized.
